



Our goal is to develop a properly curated set of geospatial data for distribution to and use by consortium members for urban environmental health research. Some of these data may be contributed by CANUE members, and some will be developed with CANUE resources or staff.

EACH DATA SET WILL HAVE A SHARING AGREEMENT THAT CLEARLY IDENTIFIES ALL CONDITIONS OF USE.

Conditions of use will be set by the data providers, and CANUE will not re-distribute any dataset without a signed agreement. The examples below represent a range of typical data use conditions and restrictions.

PLEASE PROVIDE ANY COMMENTS, ADDITIONS AND SUGGESTIONS

Current use restrictions or limitations on the input data for derived exposure metrics (For example, could the data be backward engineered to reveal proprietary data or place developer in conflict with other current data use agreements)

- Must be affiliated with a University (student, staff, faculty)
- Open data, can freely distribute
- Must get permission from providers of input data (or include in citations)

Contact options

- notification of data request and use are not required
- notify when data are requested, but data users are free to use as per data use agreement
- notification is required with conditions determined on a per use basis

Methods of data access and distribution

- provide to CANUE for archiving and distribution; full public availability within and outside consortium
- provide to CANUE for archiving and distribution; available to consortium members only
- provide to CANUE for archiving and distribution; data use request granted on per case basis from data author
- do not provide to CANUE for archiving and distribution; only provide data summary, data access and distribution granted on a per case basis from data author

DRAFT: DATA SHARING EXAMPLES

Restriction on use(s)

- no use limits; full public availability within and outside consortium
- no use limits within consortium members, understanding data cannot be distributed beyond consortium members
- require acknowledgment in published research or grant applications but not co-authorship
- require co-authorship on published research or grant applications (or offer of co-authorship)
- determined on a per use basis

Restrictions on rights to change or modify the data:

- users have full rights to change or modify data
- users cannot change or modify data
- users require data authors permission to change or modify data
- users can change, modify or enhance data but must provide back to CANUE

Should a time limit be placed on the access and use of these data?

- no expiration date on data use, users are free to hold and use data in perpetuity
- yes, to be determined on a per use basis
